Leeds - 6 miles Manchester - 60 miles

**Leeds is in the county of Yorkshire in the north of England, 70km from Manchester.**

During the Industrial Revolution, Leeds developed into a major industrial centre and the Leeds Industrial Museum tells the story of the city's heritage. Nowadays Leeds is a commercial centre with some of the best shopping in the region, particularly the stylish Victoria Quarter.



## the college

The college is part of Leeds Metropolitan University at the Headingley Carnegie Sports Campus, which is a self-contained community offering state of the art sporting facilities with a gymnastics and tennis centre, squash courts, a 21-metre swimming pool, dance studio, athletics track and floodlit synthetic turf pitches. There is a shop on-site, and the nearest bank is a 20-minute walk away.

## accommodation

The accommodation is in a brand new development of high quality purpose-built student flats that were completed in summer 2009. All rooms are en-suite and each flat has a kitchen and communal lounge area. Rooms are cleaned weekly and towels are provided.

**Half-day 2 - Bradford and the National Media Museum** Students visit the exciting centre in the heart of the north devoted to film, photography, television, radio and the web along with an IMAX cinema.
